# Lightboard

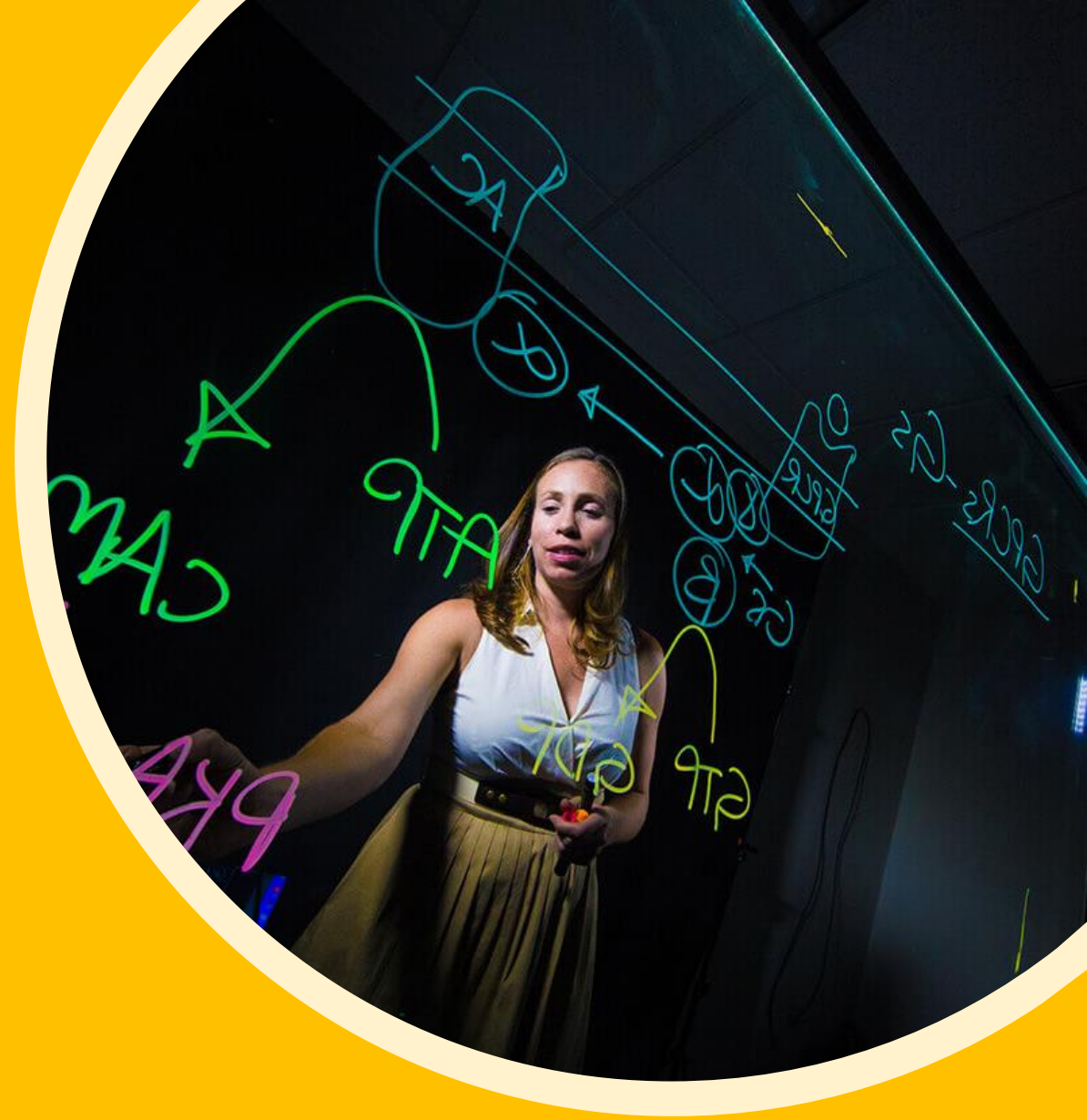
- A **Lightboard** is like a glass whiteboard full of **light**.

Before diving into how to plan and design your online course, we will first explore different concepts as well as the online course modalities offered at UCF.



#### Online vs. Remote

There are considerable differences between remote instruction and online teaching and learning though overlap does exist. A simplistic way to distinguish between the two is that remote instruction is the moving of content for face-to-face instruction to an online format and is typically associated with numerous synchronous meetings (such as Zoom).

I have done a little with video before, but I am not quite sure how to facilitate discussions and effectively lecture using video.

Hello, I am Instructor M and have been teaching at UCF for 3 years. Like the other two faculty, I have only taught face-to-face. Now I am going to be teaching an M course for the first time. I feel comfortable teaching in person and have uploaded files and entered grades in my Webcourses@UCF online sections, but I am not really sure what to do beyond that.
